



Avirook Sen is an independent writer based in Gurgaon. He has been a reporter and editor for over 25 years, working in print, online and broadcast media. Sen launched the Hindustan Times' Mumbai edition as resident editor, edited Mid-Day, and was executive editor of the news channel NewsX. He has written on a wide range of subjects, from cricket to terrorism and, most recently, crime. His work has appeared regularly in prominent publications both in India and abroad.

His first book, 'Looking for America' (Harper Collins, 2010) was described by Vogue magazine as a 'Kerouac-like' travelogue, and enthusiastically reviewed.

His bestselling second book, 'Aarushi', (Penguin, 2015) has reignited a national debate on the criminal justice system, on media ethics, and Indian middle class attitudes.
